Question 2. (1 mark) Reduce the fraction $\frac{58}{76}$ to lowest terms.


Question 3. (1 mark) Bring the fraction $\frac{3.25}{5.75}$ to higher terms to eliminate the decimals.

$$6(3-yx)(x+y-1)-(3-a)(x+y)$$



$$(x-1)(x+y+z-1)$$

Question 7. (3 marks) Simplify the following:

$$\frac{x^3(xy^2)^3y^{-3}}{(x^{-1}y^2)^3}$$

Question 8. (2 mark) Evaluate the following to two decimal places:

$$\ln(e^8(1.3))$$

Question 9. (1 mark) Rewrite the exponential $9^2 = 81$ as a logarithm.

Question 10. (1 mark) Rewrite the logarithm $\ln 1 = 0$ as an exponential.

Question 11. (1 mark each)

Evaluate the following to two decimal places:

- 1. $\sqrt{152}$
- 2. $321^{\frac{2}{3}}$
- 3. $\frac{1-4^{-1}}{2}$
- 4. $\sqrt{19} 7.4523$

Question 12. (4 marks)

Let r = 0.045, S = 2150, P = 201. Solve for t and evaluate t to two decimal places:

$$S = P\left[1 - \frac{rt}{365}\right]$$

Question 13. (2 marks)

Let PMT = 244, i = 0.06, n = 36, evaluate FV to two decimal places:

$$FV = PMT\left[\frac{(1+i)^n - 1}{i}\right]$$

Question 14. (3 marks)

Solve for x:

$$1+3(x+2)+(x-8)-(x-1)=4(4x-2)$$

Question 15. (3 marks)

Solve for x:

$$\frac{2}{7}(3x-2) - \frac{3}{5}(5x-2) = \frac{7}{20} - x$$

Question 16. (2 marks)


Change the ratio 30:90:118 to lower terms.

Question 17. (2 marks)

Change the ratio 1.3:7.1:10.3 to higher terms to eliminate the decimals of each proportion.

Question 18. (4 marks)

John the farmer decides to sell part of his land to help his financial situation. He sells two lots one of $1\frac{1}{2}$ and the other of $2\frac{1}{6}$ hectares at a price of \$25 000 per hectare. He then sells an additional lot of $4\frac{1}{5}$ hectare at a price of \$15 000 per hectare. How much will John obtain from the sale of the lots?



Question 20. (4 marks)

Emilie and Yann are getting insured at their new appartment. The insurance cost \$564.00. They agree that the cost will be divided in a ratio of five to seven and that Emilie will pay more. How much money will Yann pay for the insurance?

Question 21. (4 marks)

If a business has a net income of \$2 120 000 that is split between its three investor in the ratio $\frac{1}{3}$: $\frac{1}{7}$: $\frac{1}{9}$, how much will each investor receive?

Bonus Question (2 marks) Isolate n (i.e. solve for n).
