Question 4. (3 marks) Simplify the following:

$$= \frac{48}{5}+3 = \frac{48+15}{5}=\frac{63}{5}$$

Question 13. (2 marks)

$$= 29.065.49$$

Question 14. (3 marks)

Solve for x:

$$1+3(x+2)+(x-8)-(x-1)=4(4x-2)$$

$$1+3x+6+x-8-x+1=16x-8$$

$$3x = 16x-8$$

$$8 = 13x$$

$$\frac{8}{13} = x$$

Question 15. (3 marks)

Solve for x:

$$\frac{2}{7}(3x-2) - \frac{3}{5}(5x-2) = \frac{7}{20} - x$$

$$\frac{140(\frac{3}{7})(3x-2) - 140(\frac{3}{5})(5x-2)}{40(3x-2) - 84(5x-2)} = \frac{140(\frac{7}{20}) - 140x}{40(3x-2) - 84(5x-2)} = \frac{7(7) - 140x}{120x - 80 - 420x + 168} = \frac{49 - 140x}{39} = \frac{160}{160} \times \frac{39}{160} = \frac{1}{160}$$

Question 18. (4 marks)

John the farmer decides to sell part of his land to help his financial situation. He sells two lots one of $1\frac{1}{2}$ and the other of $2\frac{1}{6}$ hectares at a price of \$25 000 per hectare. He then sells an additional lot of $4\frac{1}{5}$ hectare at a price of \$15 000 per hectare. How much will John obtain from the sale of the lots?

amount from sales =
$$\left(1\frac{1}{2} + 2\frac{1}{6}\right) 25000 + 4\frac{1}{5}(15000)$$

= $\left(\frac{3}{2} + \frac{13}{6}\right) 25000 + \frac{21}{5}(15000)$
= $91666.67 + 63000$
= $$154666.67$

... John will obtain \$154 666.67 from the sales of the lots.

Question 19. (4 marks)

Jean opens a savings account with zero interest at his favorite bank. He makes an initial deposit of \$4 000 on January 1st, he withdraws \$1 300 on April 1st, he deposits \$700 on August 1st, he deposits \$200 on October 1st. What was Jean average monthly balance of his savings account for the year?

Question 21. (4 marks)

If a business has a net income of \$2 120 000 that is split between its three investor in the ratio $\frac{1}{3}:\frac{1}{7}:\frac{1}{9}$, how much will each investor receive?

The LCD of $\frac{1}{3}$, $\frac{1}{7}$, $\frac{1}{9}$ is 63. We bring our ratio to higher terms by multiplying with LCD. 21:9:7 and the total number of parts is 37the first investor will get $\frac{21}{37}(2120000) = \1203243.24 the second investor will get $\frac{9}{37}(2120000) = \515675.68 the third investor will get $\frac{7}{37}(2120000) = \401081.08 s Question (2 marks)... the first investor will get
