Question 1. Given the following symbolization key:

A: Aristotle was a biomechanist.

G: Gaius Julius was a tyrant.

I: Ibn Sina was a Constructivist.

P_1 : Aristotle high fived Plato.

P_2 : Gaius Julius high fived Plato.

P_3 : Ibn Sina high fived Plato.

N: Aristotle was a Platonist.

W_1 : Aristotle walked to Aegina.

W_2 : Gaius Julius walked to Aegina.

W_3 : Ibn Sina walked to Aegina.

Translate each English language statement into Propositional Logic.

- (1 mark) It is not the case that Aristotle was a biomechanist.
- (3 marks) Aristotle was a biomechanist or not a Platonist, if he walked to Aegina.

Translate each Propositional Logic statement into English.

- (2 marks) $\neg\neg N$
- (3 marks) $\neg(P_1 \wedge W_3) \rightarrow W_1$

- $\neg A$
- $W_1 \rightarrow (A \vee \neg N)$
- It is not the case that Aristotle was not a Platonist.
- If it is not the case that both Aristotle high fived Plato and Ibn Sina walked to Aegina then Aristotle walked to Aegina.
